ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

A Pass in Sijil Pelajaran Malaysia (SPM) /equivalent with credit in Bahasa Melayu / Bahasa Malaysia or Bahasa Melayu /Bahasa Malaysia July Paper. *and*

A diploma or other qualifications recognized by the Malaysian Government and approved by the University's Senate; *or*

A pass from the Ministry of Education's Matriculation Programme/ Foundation Studies of Science UTM/ Foundation Programme UITM with a Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) not less than 2.00; *or*

A pass in Sijil Tinggi Agama Malaysia (STAM) not less than the Jayyid level; *or*

A pass in Sijil Tinggi Persekolahan Malaysia (STPM) with a Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) not less than 2.00 and obtained:

Minimum Grade C in General Studies *and*

Minimum Grade C in any other two subjects *and*

Obtained at least Band 1 in Malaysian University English Test (MUET) *and*

Satisfied all the specific requirements stipulated by the programme applied for (for details of the requirements, please visit our website at www.usim.edu.my)
